Physical Education in Schools: Results of an Electronic School Survey Stage 1

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Legislation

- Revised Curriculum
- Minimum Content
- Legislation prevents prescribing amount of time devoted to any subject

Department of Education Key Action

 Establish baseline for number of children of compulsory school age participating in a minimum of two hours quality physical education per week

3 Stages to Establishing Baseline

- 1. Electronic Survey (March 2012)
- 2. Education and Training Inspectorate Survey -Primary - not scheduled
- 3. Education and Training Inspectorate Survey -Post - Primary - not scheduled

Use of School Facilities: Post - Primary

- 65% return 141 out of 216
- 92% facilities available for community use
- 94% facilities available for sporting purposes
- 50% facilities available for "other" activities
- Three quarters of community use outside school hours

Use of School Facilities: Primary

- 57% 491 out of 854
- 44% sports facilities available for community use
- 29% school facilities in BELB area available for community use compared with 44% in WELB and 46% in NEELB, SEELB and SELB areas
- Sport is main reason for community use of Primary School facilities
- Three quarters of community use took place outside school hours

Use of School Facilities: Special Schools

- 22% 9 out of 41
- 2 schools shared facilities with other schools primary and post primary
- The majority (8 schools) used other facilities to enhance PE provision
- 3 schools facilities available for community use, sporting and other purposes both within and outside school hours

Community Use of All Schools

- Over 55% of all responding schools made their sports facilities available for community use
- 87% made facilities available for sporting purposes
- 53% for "other" activities
- Post primary schools more likely to share facilities than primary schools (92% and 44% respectively)
- Community use of schools was most likely to take place outside school hours (77% of participating schools)

Pupil Level Targets for PE in Primary Schools

- DE does not require schools to set PE targets
- 86% of Primary Schools did not set pupil level targets, 14% did
- Of the 71 schools which did set targets, 48% set both quantitative and qualitative targets.
- 23% set only quantitative targets.
- **30%** set only qualitative targets.
