4. Sporting Clubs Business Cases	Members were given an overview of the process and context of Sporting Clubs and of what the investment aims to achieve. KPI monitoring was discussed. Members were given assurance of the process regarding management of any potential underperformance of grantees.

While Golf have used their senior professionals to target high level performance benefits, their programme is more focused on Team Ireland (the top amateurs as they turn professional).

Sport NI Sporting Winners investment represents 8% of the Sports Programme.
